Looking ahead to 2025, we're excited about the projects in both the Pilbara and Metro areas. Our asphalt crews are preparing to begin the MRWA nightshift campaign, introducing new initiatives in collaboration with MRWA, including the use of a new binder called BioBinder. BioBinders, which are the future of bitumen supply, consist of about 15% biooil with similar properties to refined This bitumen. innovation sustainability benefits, such as reducing carbon emissions and minimizing the use of crude oil bitumen. We're looking forward to working closely with MRWA on this initiative and exploring the potential of BioBinders in future projects.

Our Transport division has been hard at work, supporting a new client across their mining tenements in WA and beyond. One major project involved relocating wash bays from Onslow to the Weipa Operations in Far North Queensland—a staggering 5,500-kilometer journey across the top of Australia!

In addition, we've started mobilizing offroad road trains from Brown & Hurley in
Rockhampton, QLD, to the Weipa site.
The unpredictable weather has played
havoc with the Peninsula Development
Road, resulting in multiple closures. To
ensure seamless operations, **KEE** has
implemented a barge solution from Cairns
to Weipa, set to commence in late
December. This will continue until the road
reopens or all equipment is delivered.

We welcome two new drivers, Ryan Hindriksen and Nick Pinguet and Courtney Brown has joined our Logistics Admin Team.

The Fuel division has started regular deliveries to the Fremantle Bridges project with Laing O'Rourke, currently servicing three days a week and set to increase to five days per week in the New Year.

KEE Fuel also played a pivotal role in the successful completion of the Ellenbrook-Morley and Yanchep rail lines, ensuring equipment was fuelled and operational in line with contracted schedules. As these projects near completion, KEE Fuel continues to provide ad hoc support while the finishing touches are applied.
